DWP presents practical, interactive, hands-on workshops.

DWP partner schools commit to an annual inservice series that provides sustained learning over time.

DWP customizes workshops to meet individual district needs.

DLC hosts monthly "social readings."

DLC members gather virtually to discuss current research, centered around educational technology and digital literacies.
